Ruth Bader Ginsburg Hall is an iconic neoclassical skyscraper located on the Rutgers University–Newark campus. Built in 1929, this 17-story building has been a prominent feature of the Newark skyline, overlooking Harriet Tubman Square. Originally home to Rutgers Law School from 1975 to 1999, it has since been renovated into residential housing for 330 undergraduate and graduate students, including many pursuing legal studies. It was renamed in memory of the late Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, who taught law at Rutgers University from 1963 to 1972. The building stands as a tribute to her legacy of civil rights advocacy and legal scholarship.

Rutgers - Camden RUTGERS SCHOOL OF NURSING - CAMDEN

The Nursing and Science Building, strategically situated next to City Hall and the Light Rail station, enhances Camden's urban landscape. Nestled on a triangular site between the Rutgers-Camden campus and Cooper Medical Center, it serves as the first academic building beyond Rutgers-Camden's traditional boundaries. Designed to foster a dynamic and flexible interior, it supports diverse student needs for learning, collaboration, and social interaction throughout their four year program. The interior design reflects the building's focus on nursing and scientific research, with finishes inspired by the intricate patterns of DNA genotyping. Spanning nearly 9,200 square feet, it features state of the art simulation and clinical skills spaces, an interactive case study room, and Scale-Up Discovery classrooms that promote team learning.

Rutgers - Extension Research Center **TUCKERTON MARINE FIELD STATION**

The Rutgers University Marine Field Station (RUMFS) is a field facility of the Rutgers University Department of Marine and Coastal Sciences (DMCS). It is a working lab with on-going graduate and postdoctoral level research occurring year-round. RUMFS is uniquely situated, across from the Little Egg Inlet in the Mullica River-Great Bay estuary: one of the most pristine estuaries on the east coast.

Rutgers - New Brunswick HELIX

The first tower consisting of 12 floors, 8 floors of which will be the new home of the Robert Wood Johnson Medical School on the New Brunswick campus. It will include a modern mix of educational spaces for learning, training, laboratory work, and discovery. A translational research facility equipped with laboratories will advance the work of 80 research teams, and an innovation hub will support economic growth, entrepreneurship, and business incubation.
